Not An Easy Decision...!

Talk this week has focused very much on the announcement by the National Education Union of the proposed industrial action to be taken by its members on the 1st February. As I said in my WEDUC post following the announcement, I am not able as yet to give you an accurate picture of how this will affect the school but at this point I can say there will be significant closures to classes across the school. The decision taken by the NEU is the result of a very long conversation with the Government which has sadly not reached an agreeable conclusion. In my time as both a teacher and Head Teacher I can count on one hand the amount of times industrial action has happened in this country and I know that the teachers did not take the decision to vote for industrial action lightly. As soon as I have a clear understanding of the impact the NEU action will have on the school, I shall let you know and I hope to do this by Monday next week.

This week we have spent time focusing on the foundation subjects as it has been curriculum week. The teachers, in their role as subject leaders, have had the opportunity to teach each other's classes and I know they have really enjoyed the experience and it has been excellent for their professional development. I think, as schools, we tend to value subjects like English, Maths and Science more than others like French, Music and Art and these weeks are a good reminder that the curriculum is all encompassing and not just about the core subjects, which are of course important but as part of a wider experience for the children.

We have also had the first of our trips this term with Year 1 going to Blackpool Zoo. It is such a fantastic trip and I was very sorry not to be able to attend due to interviewing. Despite the chilly weather they all had a

fab time which was great to hear. Experiences like this are so important to the children and something we very much believe in as a school. I know that for you as parents they can sometimes be hard to support but they really are worth the cost as they mean so much to the chil-
