

 Consolidation of children's knowledge of Phase 2 and Phase 3.


 Help them to read and spell words with adjacent consonants (e.g slip, trap, bank, strong) and

polysyllabic words (words with more than one syllable e.g. sandpit, dolphin, yesterday)



Phase 5 Phonics

 Broaden children's knowledge of phonemes and graphemes.

A phoneme – the way a 'sound' is pronounced

A grapheme – the way a 'sound' is written e.g.






- Children will learn new graphemes for sounds they already know...
- e.g. ai rain (PHASE 3) ay - day (PHASE 5) a-e - cake (PHASE 5)

- As well as alternative pronunciations for the same grapheme...
- e.g. ea tea, head and break

By the end of Year 1 we are aiming for children to able to...

- Respond speedily with the correct sound when shown any grapheme that has been taught.
- For any given sound, write the common graphemes.
- Apply phonic knowledge and skill as the prime approach to reading and spelling unfamiliar words which are not completely decodable.
- Read and spell many common exception words (tricky words).
- Read and spell phonetically decodable words of more than one syllable.
