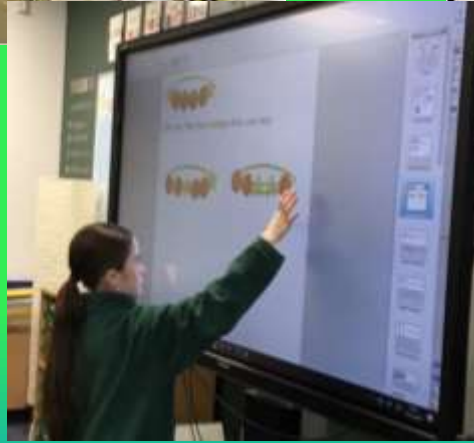

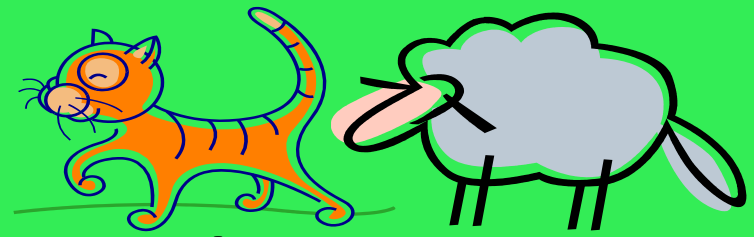

- Regular attendance is crucial for a child's educational progress and development. Attending school regularly ensures that children do not miss out on important learning opportunities and allows them to fully engage with their peers and teachers.
 - The government is putting a lot of emphasis on school attendance rates at the moment.
 - Every child's target is 100% attendance; the government minimum is 96%+.
 - We work very closely with our Local Authority Attendance Officer to help families maintain a good level of school attendance.
 - If your child is just slightly under the weather, please still send them in, and we will make sure to give you a call if they become too unwell to stay for the full school day.
 - If your child is not well enough to attend school, we kindly ask that you ring the office to inform us.

If you want any support with attendance, please ask us or call in at the school office.

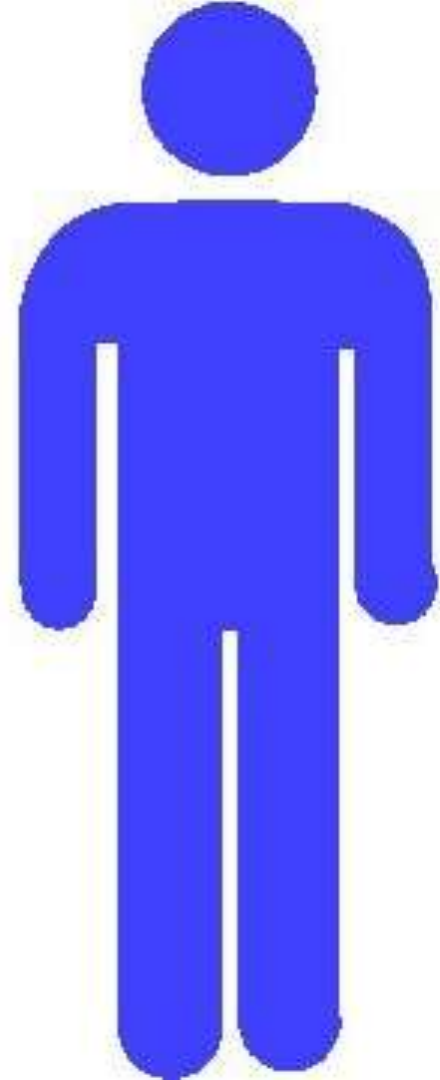

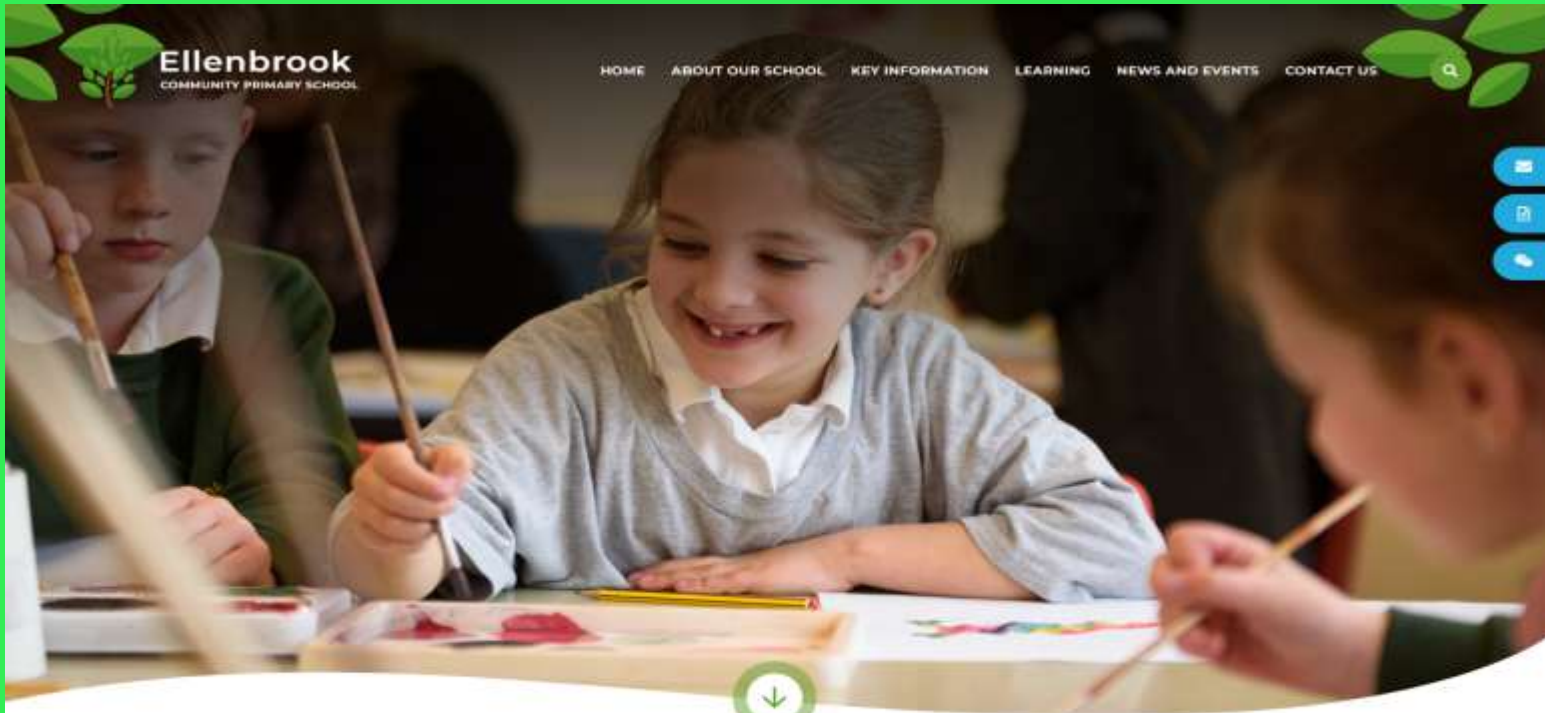

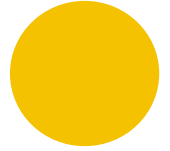
Getting to Know Each Other
