# Updates from the Office....

- When a child comes into school through the office if they are either late or have been to an appointment you MUST sign them in with a reason.

- Please make sure that if your child has any medicines/inhalers which are kept in school that they are up to date and you have completed a medical permission form for this academic
- Any letters, slips or forms can be posted in the white post box attached to the wall outside the school office. This box is checked regularly during the day.
- If your child is attending an independent school for an entrance exam can we ask that you complete a leave of absence form and return it to the office. This absence will be authorised by the school.

## Things to Remember ....

Please can you let the office know if your child is going home with another adult before pick up. Can we also ask you to make sure they are aware of the school's collection arrangements.

# **One Way System**

The one way system is still in place...please can you tell anyone picking up who isn't familiar with it the correct procedure so they don't get a grilling from me!

#### Uniform

Please can I ask you all to check your child's uniform as I have seen a lot of worn items that don't fit in with our uniform policy.

The biggest culprit seems to be shoes and I have seen a number of children wearing ankle boots as opposed to shoes. This type of footwear falls outside our policy and isn't allowed as part of the uniform.

#### Staff Car Park

From time to time there are occasions when the staff car park gate is left open when staff or deliveries are coming into the school.

This week we have had parents 'nipping' into the school through the gate whilst they are open. Please can we ask you not to do that as it is very dangerous. The gate is usually open because of a delivery meaning there are vehicles moving around.

Please can I ask you not to use the car park as a cut through when dropping off or collecting.

# **Medicines**

Can I just remind you all of the procedure for medication in school. Any medicine that needs to be given to the children during the day must come via the office (not the class teacher) and a medicines form completed.
