Updates from the Office....

- When a child comes into school through the office if they are either late or have been to an appointment you MUST sign them in with a reason.

Pupil Absence

As it is the beginning of the second half of the Spring term, I wanted to take the opportunity to remind you of



take the opportunity to remind you of the policy the school has in relation to holidays during term time.

A leave of absence from school is only granted in exceptional circumstances and a family holiday, even if it's delayed for Covid, does not count as an exceptional circumstance and as such isn't authorised.

If you do take a family holiday during term time you may receive a penalty notice fine from the Local Authority which is currently £60 per parent per child if paid within the first 21 days. It does rise to £120 if not paid within that time.

Just a subtle reminder the one way system is still in place at school. Please can you make sure anyone who collects your child is aware of this.

Uniform


It's been great to see the children back following the half term holiday.
