Lots to talk through this week and I want to start with safeguarding which is something we take incredibly seriously as a school. A couple of things have been mentioned to me this week about things taking place outside of school which are not really in our remit. I thought this would be a good time to remind you all about the process of making a referral yourself if you see something outside of school that causes you a concern. On the reverse of the newsletter is a little box explaining what you can do if you do have worries around a child.

Following on from that, I just wanted to explain the school's current rules on medicine. As a school, we should not be giving the children medicine unless prescribed by a doctor and agreed with you as parents first with the appropriate medication form filled in. If your child needs to have Calpol during the day the likelihood is they aren't well enough to be in school and if they are, you will need to come into school and dispense the Calpol yourself as it is something we should not be doing as a school.

We had the second of our parent curriculum workshops this week and I wanted to thank the hardy few who ventured into school to learn about the school's approach to teaching Maths. I trust those who attended felt it was a valuable experience and a big thank you to all of the staff who have given up their time to host these events.



We also had the PTA AGM this week and I want to put on record my huge thanks to the PTA committee who have done an amazing job and thankfully have agreed to carry on next year!

Just a reminder that it's the PTA spooky disco on Thursday 19th October 2023.


Our PTA discos have been extremely well supported in the past and it would be great to see as many of the children there as possible again this term.
