The period of office will be for 4 years, unless the elected parent resigns within that period. Attached/Overleaf is a brief statement written by each candidate in support of his or her nomination.

There is one vacancy. You may therefore only vote for one person. If you vote for more than the number of vacancies, or if you mark the paper in any way, the ballot paper will be declared void.

Please return the ballot form to school either by hand through your child, or by post to arrive at the school no later than **12.00 noon** on **THURSDAY 29<sup>th</sup> APRIL 2018**. If you wish to cast your vote through your child or by post, please place your completed ballot paper (FOLDED) in an envelope. This should then be sealed and you should sign your name across the sealed flap. This procedure is designed to establish that only parents of registered pupils vote and that ballot papers cannot be identified on a personal basis. The envelope will be opened in the presence of a witness and the ballot paper placed – still folded – in the ballot box for counting at the appointed time.
