School will;

- 1. Aim to achieve high quality relationships, behaviour and high standards for all pupils
- 2. Deliver a broad and balanced curriculum which also fulfils the requirements of the National Curriculum
- 3. Encourage children to do their best at all times and in all aspects of school
- 4. Inform parents of any concerns or problems that affect their child's work or behaviour, or if there is a problem with attendance, punctuality or equipment
- 5. Set, mark and monitor homework
- 6. Arrange parents' evenings, during which, progress will be discussed and ensure that there is regular communication between school and home regarding each child's progress and provide written reports to parents
- 7. Keep parents informed about school activities through regular letters, emails, newsletters and notices about special events. Newsletters will also be posted on the school's website http://www.ellenbrookschool.com/
- 8. Provide opportunities for parents to offer their views on matters relating to the school
- 9. Provide a range of extra-curricular activities to support children's development
- 10. Take every reasonable precaution, including monitoring and filtering systems, to ensure that young people will be safe when they use the internet and ICT systems

Parents will;

- 1. Support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour and appearance
- 2. Show a keen interest in their child's school work
- 3. Encourage children to do their best at all times and in all aspects of school
- 4. Inform school immediately of any concerns or problems that may affect their child's work or behaviour (this includes any medical issues)
- 5. Support their child in homework and other home learning activities (e.g. Reading, Times Tables and Mathletics [KS2])

- 6. Attend parents' evenings and discussions about their child's progress and respond to teacher comments in the green Reading Record book/Diary
- 7. Check everyday for letters sent home and emailed, as well as visit the school website
- 8. Show an interest in school by responding to consultations
- 9. Give full support to extra-curricular events e.g. sports , arts and music
- 10. Support my child to become increasingly independent
- 11. Inform the school by telephone on the first day of absence and on any consecutive days of absence
- 12. Ensure that images taken at school events are not uploaded or shared via the internet or social media
- 13. Encourage my child to adopt safe use of the internet and digital technologies at home

Pupils will

- 1. Work their hardest all of the time
- 2. Respect everyone in the school
- 3. Follow the school and class rules and adhere to the school's behaviour policy
- 4. Try to become increasingly independent as they progress through school
- 5. Tell a parent or adult at school if something worries them or makes them feel uncomfortable

I also consent to my child being attended to by a member of staff in the event of him/her soiling or wetting themselves. This will be done in line with the school's intimate care policy. Parents will of course be informed if this happens. If, as a parent, you do not wish this to happen then you will be called into school to attend to it yourself.
